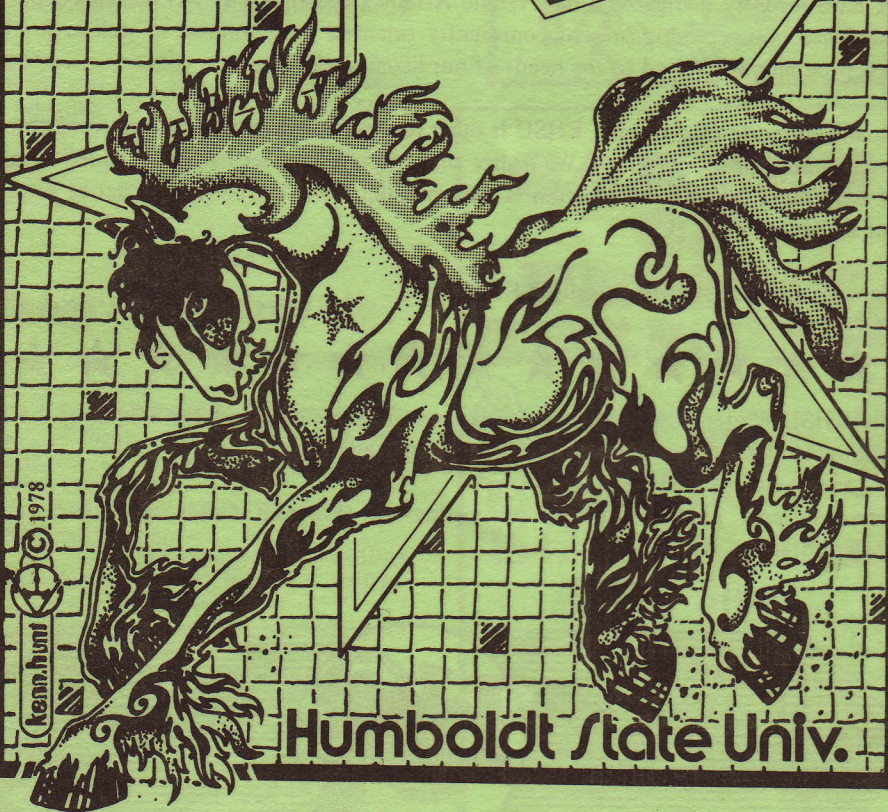

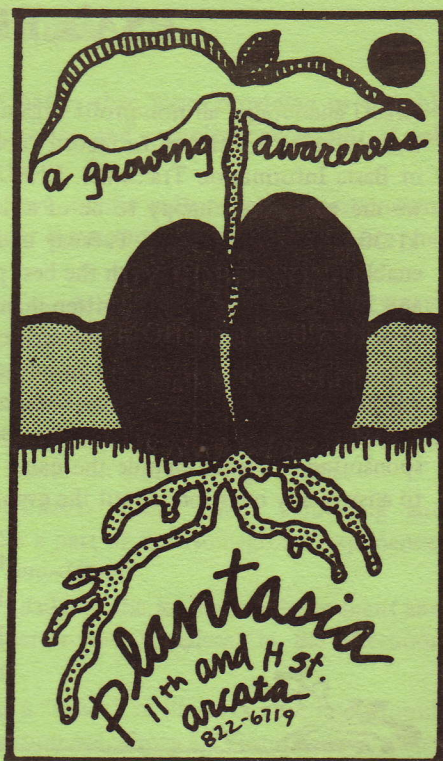

KHSU encourages all non-profit organizations or interested individuals in the Humboldt County area to feel free to record Public Service Announcements, Free Speech Messages or Basic Information Transmits. KHSU is a community-oriented public radio station, and we are more than happy to be of assistance to the public. Recording times are 10:00 - 11:30, 3:00 - 4:30 every Tuesday and Thursday afternoon. For our protection, and to enable us to provide you with the best possible service, KHSU now requires that all FSM's and BIT's be submitted in written manuscript from one week prior to the recording date. This will allow us to approve the script before it is recorded. We also ask that all PSA's be submitted four to seven days in advance of the scheduled event. This will allow for an adequate amount of time to publicize the events and happenings. All PSA's should include what, when and where the event takes place, as well as the name of the group sponsoring it. Please include the name and phone number of the person to be contacted to answer any questions about the event.

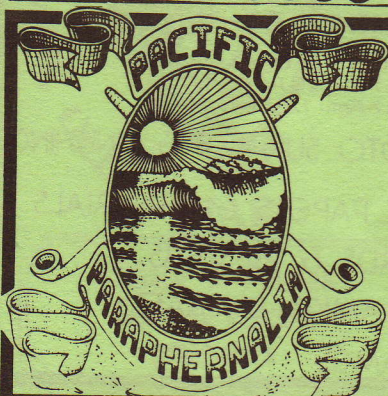
